We now have 802 members listed on the roster: 453 in good standing, 50 Life Members (spouses of deceased members), 10 Associate Members, 3 Heritage Members, 284 Past Members (members with unpaid dues for three or more years), 66 members with dues in arrears, one Honorary Member (NAAV), and one Gray Dragon, who is relieved of annual dues.

Past members do not receive newsletters or reunion information until their dues are brought up to date. Membership is \$10.00 per year. Past

members may be reinstated by sending the \$10.00 reinstatement fee plus \$10.00 for each year they wish to pay their dues. This is an effective policy because of the cost of mailing newsletters and reunion information.

If you are unsure whether your dues are up-to-date and you receive your newsletter by mail, check the date in the upper right corner of the mailing. It shows the month and year to which your dues are paid. If you receive your newsletter electronically and wish to know your dues date, log onto our website. The dues date will be listed in the date column on the right of your name on the membership roster. Some members find it convenient to pay their dues several years in advance. This can save you postage and the Treasurer, Secretary, and Web Master a considerable amount of time in processing payments.

The current membership is posted on our website. You may need a password to access certain parts of the website. The Web Master can provide you with the password. Members not on-line can request a hard copy of the roster by calling or writing:

With the Microsoft Access Navy Nuclear Weapons Membership information program up and running this database that will continue to grow with new members and their data. Once your information is in the system it is in there forever. Through the Access program we currently have the following reports that we can print out:

- Rank report,
- Program entry date (this report helps us identify the Gray Dragon)
- Member contact list (All past/present members)
- Duty station report
- Member contact report includes all past and present members and includes all past members that have been removed from the Treasurers Roster.

As of 4 June 2017 we have 1214 Past/Present members entered in the database. Out of the 1214 shipmates 637 are listed with their duty stations. This information comes from a members application form or them filling out the personal profile sheet and mailing it to me. This is why I ask everyone to write your military history down with duty stations and dates in the Navy. That way I can enter your history into the database. But I can ONLY do that if you write it down and email or mail it to me. I have been going through the cruise books adding shipmates that are now already in the system.
