#### Secretary's Message

The most notable items from the meeting were that Jack Grieves was stepping down from the board, with Dwight Chipperfield assuming the duties of Storekeeper, and that with the Historian stepping down from the board in 2017 the memorabilia collection would likely be disposed of by either returning the items to the original donors or gifting them to a museum. #### Historian's Message

With the Microsoft Access Navy Nuclear Weapons Membership information program up and running this database that will continue to grow with new members and their data. Once your information is in the system it is in there forever. Through the Access program we currently have the following reports that we can print out:

- Rank report,
- Program entry date (this report helps us identify the Gray Dragon)
- Member contact list (All past/present members)
- Duty station report
- Member contact report includes all past/present members, this report includes all past members that have been removed from the Treasurers Roster.

As of 30 November 2016 we have 1052 Past/Present members entered in the database. Out of the 1052 shipmates 615 are listed with their duty stations. This information comes from a members application form or them filling out the personal profile sheet and mailing it to me. This is why I ask everyone to write your military history down with duty stations and dates in the Navy. That way I can enter your history into the database. But I can ONLY do that if you write it down and email or mail it to me.
